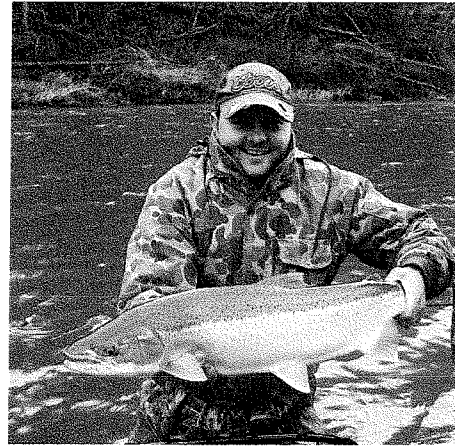
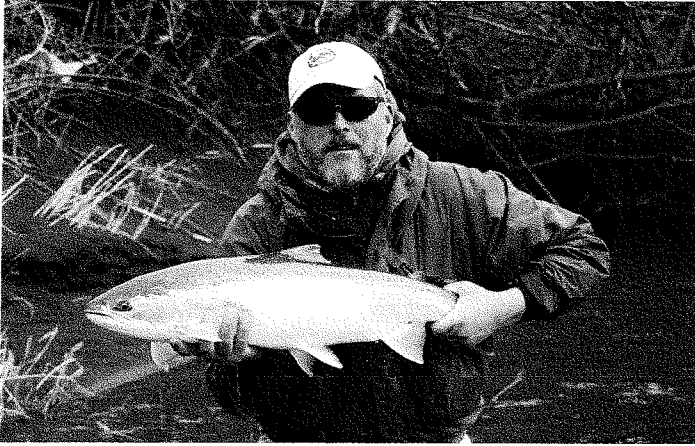


Drake Radditz Fishing

Winter steelhead season is off to a good start. We hooked our first on November 29th, a nice hatchery hen about ten pounds - a great kick-off to the 2009-2010 season. We've been picking up chrome bright hatchery fish for about a week now, although fishing has slowed due to low clear cold water. December through February I will be concentrating on the North Fork Nehalem River which boasts an excellent run of early hatchery Steelhead.



Now through January 1 Book a Full Day Trip - All Equipment Included: \$300 a day for two anglers.

That is \$50 off a regular full day trip.

With the next rains we should see a big push of fish. The peak of the run usually occurs about the first of the year and lasts through March, with more wild fish interspersed later in the season. If you are interested in catching that fish of a lifetime, say a 20 pound native, we've got a few choices for you. February - April is typically when the Wild, biggest, strongest fish enter the North Coast rivers and the Trask, Wilson, Nehalem, and Necanicum are some of my favorite places to go chasing after these true trophies.

If you are looking to take fish home for the table, I can cater to that request and fish a hatchery river. If you choose to chase after the BIG boys and girls which we must release unharmed, I am your guide. I like to fish stretches of river that are off the beaten path and I would like to keep them that way, so wherever I take you please keep that location to yourself. This is why we catch steelhead in these places.

I guide fly fishermen and bait fishermen alike and I will cater to whichever style you prefer. All gear is provided but if you have your own rod and reel you like to fish, feel free to bring it. I guide out of a 17' Heated Koffler Drift Boat and have a 14' Maravia Raft for the smaller more remote rivers. If you like to get away from the crowds, this is for you. I will put you on the fish but I can't put them on your line, you have to catch them yourself! Let's go fishing! It makes a great gift.
